Curriculum

At Swinemoor we aim to ensure that each child attains their full potential through a broad and balanced curriculum. We attach great importance to work on English and Mathematics and we believe that public performance in artistic and sporting activities is essential to celebrate achievements. We regularly assess and set targets. Further details are available on the school website.

Sharing of information

Good communication between the school and home is vital. Parents will receive a termly written report on their child's progress. There will be opportunities to discuss progress with the teacher. However, parents should inform the school about any issues that might affect their child's work or behaviour. If parents have general queries they should contact the school office, via email or telephone in the first instance.

Discipline and behaviour

The school has a behaviour and anti-bullying policy. Children will be expected to observe this policy. If there are problems, the school will contact parents in order that together we can support the children concerned. Parents should also contact the school if they are concerned. Parents have a vital role in fostering good behaviour, and parental influence is critical in shaping pupil attitude and behaviour.

All staff are committed to working with you in a professional and courteous manner and have the right to work in a safe, supportive environment. Verbal abuse and intimidation are not acceptable. Violence towards staff will not be tolerated and action will be taken against anyone who behaves in a violent and abusive way. Swinemoor has a zero tolerance policy towards any such behaviour and appropriate steps will be taken to deal with this issue. Please ensure you set a good example for your child by behaving in a polite, kind and respectful manner towards staff for the benefit of children and adults using the school site.

Homework

The purpose of homework is to provide a partnership between the school and parents and carers in pursuing the aims of the school. Swinemoor Primary Schools' Learning Beyond the Classroom books extend school learning into the home, particularly through reading, and of course it prepares children for the requirements of the secondary school. These tasks encourage the development of independent learning but also encourages parents and children to talk about what the children are learning.

We ask that parents try to -:

- Show that they value homework
- Give encouragement and praise when work has been completed
- Provide support and opportunities for children to complete the tasks set

Uniform

The school has a school uniform which children are encouraged to wear. This consists of-

- a red coloured sweatshirt. These are available through the school, or from supermarkets
- grey/black trousers or skirt/school dress
- white shirt/polo shirt
- sensible black shoes
- PE / games kit (red shorts, white t-shirt)
- Jewellery: single stud earrings are permitted, but with the exception that they are removed for PE and games lessons for health and safety reasons; watches may also be worn.

Concerns

If you have any concerns or worries about your child, please contact the school office. An appointment to speak to your child's class teacher can then be made if necessary. It is often best to deal with problems as early as possible.
